Case for Support:

Currently, 24 million low-income homeowner families live in the United States and that is expected to grow (*Rebuilding Together, Inc.*). In Tulsa City Limits, there are almost 55,000 low-income homeowners (*US Census*). There are 8,241 homes in Tulsa City Limits that are considered sub-standard and an additional 16,598 considered fair that can become sub-standard if home repairs are not addressed (*INCOG*). Rebuilding Together Tulsa works to address the home repair needs of Tulsa homeowners living on limited incomes in the most efficient way through collaborative partnerships, volunteer labor, diverse funding streams and leveraging resources.

At the beginning of the year, there were 115 homeowners in the waiting pool for home repairs. By making these repairs, Rebuilding Together Tulsa strives to make an impact on the lives of these homeowners by providing a safe, secure and weatherproof living environment; decreasing their energy bills; assisting them in their desire to remain living in their home; improve their neighborhood; and help end sub-standard housing for their community.

Volunteers work year-round and several volunteer groups work on a weekly basis making repairs to homes as part of four programs: R.O.O.T. (Repairs Offered Other Times), Roofs, Safe at Home (home modifications) and Energy Efficiency. The R.O.O.T. program includes all other repairs not offered as part of the other three programs and can include electrical, plumbing, painting and much more. Rebuilding Together Tulsa has the ability to rally hundreds of volunteers for its repair services.

Together, with your partnership, Rebuilding Together Tulsa can continue to serve low-income homeowners in Tulsa. As we look to the future, we will strategically work towards reaching all low-income homeowners in the Tulsa Metropolitan Area with their home repair needs that will provide a safe, secure and weatherproof home.

As you will see detailed in this packet, \$838,474 is needed this fiscal year, to make repairs for 150 Tulsa homeowners living on limited incomes. Please consider being a partner with Rebuilding Together Tulsa to make a difference for your neighbor. Your financial support will make a difference!

Repairs are made on a year-round basis.

R.O.O.T. Program:

A general program sponsorship will allow RTT to utilize funding where the biggest need is in the community. Funding can be used for any of the repair needs listed below or others not identified. This may include repairs such as:

- Electrical
- Plumbing
- Door locks
- Carbon monoxide/smoke detectors
- Extermination
- Carpentry
- Paint prep (including testing for lead paint and safe work practices to reduce exposure to homeowners)
- Interior and Exterior paint
- Yard clean-up
- Gutters
- Exterior house numbers
- Other repairs identified on a case by case basis

Roofs:

One of the biggest needs is for roof replacement or repair. Many of the other repairs that are offered cannot be made until the roof is repaired or replaced.

- Roof repair
- Roof replacement

Energy Efficiency :

- Install insulation
- Replace broken windows
- Install weather stripping around windows and doors
- Replace incandescent light bulbs with CFLs (compact fluorescent light bulbs)
- Install Energy Star qualified lighting fixtures
- Install daylight sensors or timers on all exterior lighting
- Install smoke and CO detectors
- Replace air conditioner filters with pleated filters
- Install exhaust fans in bathrooms and kitchens
- Install water conserving fixtures
- Plant trees or use native plant species in landscaping projects
- Heat/Air
- Energy Star Appliances

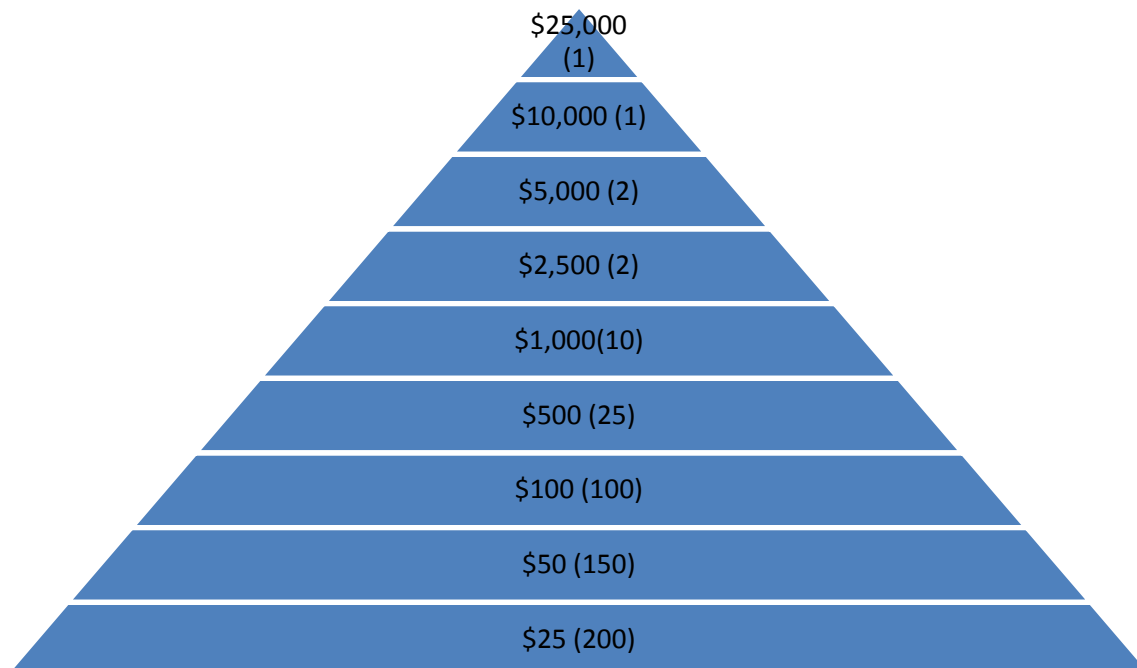

Construction Materials:

Professional Service:

Licensed electricians, roofers and plumbers. Carpentry and other skilled trades such as wheelchair installation. Technical support for computers, etc.

On-Site Repair Supplies:

Rakes, step ladders, latex gloves, heavy duty work gloves, window cleaner, paper towels, trash bags.

Office/Administrative Needs:

Copier, white printer paper, plain manila file folders, letter size hanging folders, legal size hanging folders, mailing labels, printer ink cartridges, data entry personnel, client intake personnel, training.

Leave a Legacy that will help sustain Rebuilding Together Tulsa’s programs for years to come. Make a gift to Rebuilding Together Tulsa’s endowment fund.

What is an Endowment Fund?

An endowment fund is a way to ensure that your gift provides revenue for your desired charitable purpose forever. A gift to an endowment fund is never spent. Instead, it is invested and each year a portion of the earnings is made available to be spent for charitable purposes. Over time, the amount of money available will far exceed the value of the donor’s original gift and because the gifts into the fund are never spent, the fund will provide support for the charitable cause forever.

Currently, it is Rebuilding Together Tulsa’s standing policy to re-invest interest earned from the endowment fund. The current value of the fund (as of June 30, 2010) is \$10,831.87 and the board of directors feels it is important to grow the fund by re-investing the interest and seeking new donors. The investment risk is currently “conservative.” The long-term vision is that, eventually, the interest earned will be enough to run the day-to-day operations of Rebuilding Together Tulsa.

Rebuilding Together Tulsa’s endowment fund is managed by the Tulsa Community Foundation. This fund allows RTT to plan for its long-term sustainability. Gifts can be made to Rebuilding Together Tulsa or directly to the Tulsa Community Foundation. Gifts sent directly to the Tulsa Community Foundation must be noted that they are for Rebuilding Together Tulsa’s Endowment Fund.

Donors can use the Investment Commitment Form provided in this packet to make their pledge to the Endowment Fund or mail with their check. Donations can also be made online at <http://www.justgive.org/giving/donate.jsp?charityId=17811&>. Donors should designate their gift to the Endowment Fund when using their credit card online.

Causes empowers anyone with a good idea or passion for change to impact the world. Using our platform, individuals mobilize their network of friends to grow lasting social and political movements.
