**REBUILDING TOGETHER TULSA IS ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR
EMERGENCY REPAIRS RELATED TO THE RECENT ICE STORM**

(For Immediate Release -- Tulsa, Oklahoma) Rebuilding Together Tulsa, a local non-profit organization, is now accepting applications for emergency repairs caused by the recent winter storm that hit Tulsa.

Rebuilding Together Tulsa has been asked by Mayor Taylor and the City of Tulsa to help in the restoration effort after last week's ice storm. "I am very appreciative that Rebuilding Together Tulsa has stepped up to help in our recovery efforts", said Mayor Kathy Taylor. "This is another great partnership between the city with organizations, businesses and the faith community that is helping to bring people's lives back to normal."

Rebuilding Together Tulsa has been repairing homes for low-income seniors and people living with disabilities in Tulsa for the last ten years. Repairs focus on safety, security, and weatherproofing and are done at no cost to the homeowner.

Repairs will focus on some of the most urgent needs of homeowners.

Repairs will include:

- Roofs
- Re-attaching electrical boxes to homes
- Repairing damage around electrical boxes
- Replacing broken windows
- Clearing of debris from the back of homes

Applications are now being accepted. At this time to qualify homeowners must be age 60 or over, or living with a disability and must live in **Tulsa City Limits**, and own their home and meet low-income guidelines.

Homeowners are asked to call 742-6241 x1 to begin the application process.
